YOUTH LEADERSHIP CAMP

During the April school holidays, "Keeping it fresh" was this years' theme for our 20 young people who attended our Annual Youth Leadership camp in Raglan. The camp started with visits to 3 local holiday programmes learning how other programmes ran, volunteers involvement as well as participating in programme activities.

Later that evening our young people were treated to a very inspirational presentation from Pacific Beat Street TV Presenter 'Koryn Dunstan' on What makes a good leader? Koryn shared her journey on what she has learned and how some amazing people she has met has influenced her in the work she does. She talked about her work on

Pacific Beat Street and shared some memorable video clips of people she interviewed and places she visited. One memorable and entertaining video clip our young people enjoyed was Koryn interviewing David Tua.

On Day 2 of camp, our young people participated in workshops on Conflict Resolution, Ages & Stages, Volunteering and Creating games. Another highlight of the camp was a workshop on Self-Care or Te Whare Tapa Wha - The 4 Cornerstones of Maori Health presented by Eugene & Wiki of Te Ahurei A Rangatahi who are a Youth Health & Wellbeing organisation that provides Peer Education programmes to rangatahi (youth). This workshop was well received and our young people

learned aspects of how Wairua (spirit), Hinengaro (mind), Tinana (physical) & Whanau (connection) relates to your well-being.

SOUTH HAMILTON LIONS - WE SERVE YOUR COMMUNITY

The South Hamilton Lions Club has served the Hamilton Community since it was formed in 1976. The members consider Lions to be a fantastic organisation from which they gain significant personal satisfaction. The Lions' motto is "We Serve".

They are community volunteers who roll up our sleeves to help young people, elderly, the ailing, the needy and our environment. In terms of Lions time on projects and money raised, it is estimated Lions contribute more than \$100 million each year for charitable organisations in NZ and in the Pacific. This year South Hamilton Lions will be growing and selling potatoes, cutting firewood to sell for next winter, planting trees, selling books to assist a Rotary project, raising funds for the Lions Cancer lodge, collecting old spectacles for needy people in the Pacific, and supporting young people in the community including our Leos at Melville Intermediate. Increasingly young people aged 12 to 14 are joining Leos (Junior Lions) and are learning about what it is to be a volunteer and the pleasure of giving. There is an active Leos Club at Melville Intermediate with 23 members. One of their projects raised money for a guide dog.

The Glenview Community Centre have consistently been recipients of the Lions generosity for Youth Leadership Training to supporting our local community events, Childrens Day, South-Twn Talent and more recently Carols in the Park. Our local Lions club is always just a phone call away if we need their support.
